2021 marks the 127th anniversary of the Big Rock Plowing Match & Festival. Held annually since 1895, the Plowing Match has been cancelled entirely only five times.

- ♦ 1902 due to rain
- ♦ 1926 due to rain after being postponed 3 times due to heavy rains
- ♦ 1943 and 1944 due to World War II
- ♦ 2020 due to the Covid-19 Pandemic

The Plowing Match is the reason we gather and continues to be the highlight of the weekend. Plowmen and women come from near and far, bringing their tractors and plows with them to compete across two days. There are classes for 15 and younger, a farmers open class, prizewinner class, expert plowman class and more, with everyone competing to become the Sweepstakes Winner – the one who scores the most points over the weekend. Our current reigning

Sweepstakes winner is Sandra Bullington of Murfreesboro, Tennessee.

All the plowing takes place on Davis Field across the street from Plowman's Park, adjacent to the Big Rock Historical Society Museum. Stroll over or hop aboard the wagons provided by the Historical Society to view the plowing.

Plowman's Park is host to a festival of events taking place from Friday afternoon through Sunday. There is fun for the kids, adults, the whole family: in other words for everyone. Take a look at the Schedule of Events on page 2 and plan to come to the park all three days for fun as you stroll under the oaks to enjoy the Craft, Art & Vendor Show; petting zoo, Prairie State Railroad Club train rides, exhibits in the Junior & Ladies Fair buildings, horse show and much, much more. 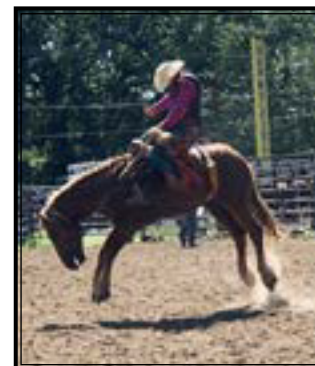


BIG ROCK BULL RIDING & BRONC MATCH

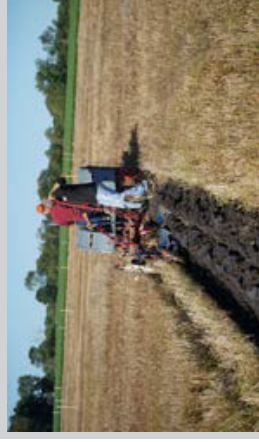

SCORECARD OF THE BIG ROCK PLOWING MATCH

Total Possible Points: 100 Perfect Score

25 points: Low back furrows distinct (back to be slightly crowning and all trash covered)

25 points: Furrows of uniform depth and width, showing slight ridge and distinct from end to end

25 points: Line of furrow

15 points: Covering of trash

10 points: General neatness of the whole and appearance of ends

• All plowmen must plow 5 inches but not more than 7 inches deep.
• All plowmen must make 7 rounds.

• No assistance to any plowmen after the first round.

• All plowmen using 16-inch plows must plow not less than 14 inches.

• All plowmen using 14-inch plows must plow not less than 12 inches.

• All plowmen using 12-inch plows must plow not less than 10 inches.

• All plowmen must leave the field at designated finish time, unless granted more time by field committee for some reasonable cause.

All plowmen will be scored back:

• 4 points for each foot in width for not finishing the land by the specified finish time.

• 4 points for each inch less than the minimum depth of 5 inches.

• 4 points for each inch in excess of the maximum depth of 7 inches.

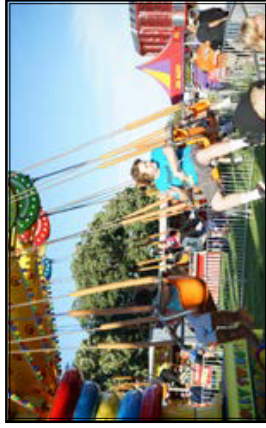

BIG ROCK PLOWING MATCH & FESTIVAL AMUSEMENT RIDES

WHY are amusement rides only on Friday night? The short answer is cost. The Association is dedicated to having the Plowing Match & Festival be family friendly with activities and events that are free or low-cost for everyone to enjoy. Underwriting the cost of the rides across the weekend has been a struggle for several years. Friday night attendance is strong, but Saturday and Sunday has been sparse with ticket sales dwindling so that we barely break even with ticket sales.

So, when Skinner Amusement let us know that 2019 would be the final time they would provide rides for us, the Board investigated a variety of options, compared costs and determined that a fresh direction was worth the risk. There were many challenges and changes related to entertainment providers, all that resulted in higher costs. How much is Friday night costing? Over \$15,000. As such for 2021, the Association is only able to underwrite Friday night. We will continue our assessment to determine what will be possible for 2022.

We encourage families to attend Friday night and return on Saturday and Sunday to explore the activities and events especially for kids, watch the plowing and browse the Junior Fair and School Exhibits. Plowman's Park is filled with family fun. See you there.

125TH FUNDRAISER UPDATE

It was 2018 when the Association reached out to the community for additional funding to build for the future with the renovation and maintenance of Plowman's Park. The community responded with over \$22,000 in funding. Since 2019, these monies have enabled the Association to complete the following:

- ◆ Renovated restroom building to be ADA compliant
- ◆ Resurfaced the floor, improved lighting and added fans in the Ladies Fair building
- ◆ Cleaned and maintained the exhaust fan and grill in the kitchen
- ◆ Upgraded the sound system
- ◆ Paid off the loan on the utility tractor

We continue to maintain, renovate and enhance. Our priority is to complete items on our list from 2018:

- ◆ Upgrade electric service to 200 amp to upgrade kitchen and add lighting throughout the park
- ◆ Improve cooking equipment in kitchen
- ◆ Blacktop all gravel roads/surfaces within the park
- ◆ Upgrade lights at Kenny Field

Your generous contributions and in-kind support is making a world of difference at Plowman's Park. Thank you.

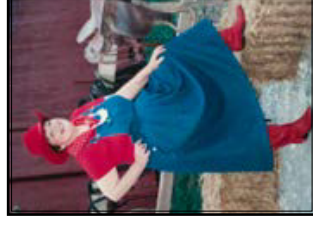
DAVIS LEGACY TO PLOWING MATCH

"When Harley Davis married Marvel Evans, two families dating back to the early history of the township who had a great interest in the Plowing Match were joined. Harley loved his community and demonstrated this by spending many hours working in various community groups." "He served on the Association Board as a Director, Secretary (1958-63) and President 1975-1976.

Harley's parents, Dwight and Anna Davis, bought land in 1957 with the idea that it could be used for the plowing competition as this field was convenient to the park. The Davis Field land was first used as home to the plowing match competition in 1961.

Both Marvel and Harley were involved with the Ladies Fair.

"Harley took pride in being an auctioneer at the Ladies Fair Bake Sale for many years. His smile and wave for everyone are part of what the heritage of the Plowing Match is all about."



The Sweepstakes Winner was established in 1978 as a Ladies Fair special award for the winner of the most ribbons in all classes. The Davis' donated funding for a silver serving piece to be awarded to the recipient. In 1991 the award was renamed the Harley Davis Memorial. Beginning in 2010 a crystal vase has been awarded. This memorial is funded through an endowment.

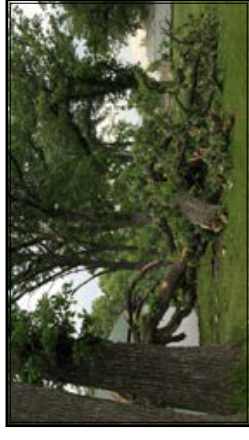
Marvel contributed her favorite recipes for the annual Ladies Fair Special Recipe in 2000 with Pecan Pie Surprise Bars and 2009 with Special K Bars. These recipes are included in the *Treasures from the Ladies Fair* recipe book.

Marvel continued the Davis family tradition of supporting the Big Rock Plowing Match with a formal provision in her Trust that the "farmland in Section 21, consisting of 49 acres, more or less, shall be used such that at least 25 acres are made available for the Big Rock Plowing Match each year for so long as the match continues to run." July 20, 2020 marked the passing of Marvel Davis.

The Association Board is extremely grateful to the Davis Family for their many years of support and the use of Davis Field. The legacy of the Davis Family to the Big Rock Plowing Match is sincerely appreciated.

PLOWMAN'S PARK...AND ANOTHER TREE CAME DOWN



The majestic, towering oaks and hickory trees are a defining feature of Plowman's Park. Bur oak trees are predominant among the swamp white oak, shag-bark hickory and a hickory cross of shag-bark with bitternut. The oldest trees are probably 150 years old, with most in the 95 plus year range. At one point there were over 160 trees on the 19-acres. Unfortunately, the number of trees are dwindling primarily due to storm damage, with drought, cold/wet springs, polar vortex and other natural causes taking a toll.

A tree assessment in 2020 identified trees in danger and/or in need of pruning/maintenance, as well as areas where trees could be planted. The Association is developing a tree replacement and maintenance plan. There will be opportunities to have a tree planted in honor of or in memory of a loved one or friend, as well as adopting a tree. To implement the plan, we will be seeking monetary donations to ensure a canopy of trees will be enjoyed for many more generations. RESTROOM BUILDING RENOVATION

The Big Rock Lion's Club continued their renovation to make the restroom building ADA compliant. To date, beginning in 2019, new epoxy-finish floors have been installed, as well as new toilets. Achievements so far this year include cutting the concrete block to accommodate the installation of new wider entrance doors and stall partitions with grab bars and appropriate hardware. With this work completed, the restroom building is ADA compliant. Motion-activated lighting, both exterior and interior, and large-capacity toilet paper dispensers, have been the most recent improvements. Upcoming renovation projects include new vanities and replacement windows.

The Lions Club and Plowing Match Association are extremely grateful to everyone who has assisted with the improvement and renovation of the restroom building. The updating has really brightened the restrooms and made such a difference for everyone. The Lions Club appreciates all your support throughout the year.



The Big Rock Lions Club is proud to be actively involved in the community providing assistance where needed. Throughout the park, under the oaks and by the Junior and Ladies Fair buildings, you may take a seat on one of several memorial benches. These gift benches have been received over the years, beginning with a pair in memory of Dean Granart, Past President of the B.R.P.M. and Don (Toot) Lee, Leader of the Premiers Band. More recently one in Loving Memory of Harold "Sonny" Alfredson and another in In Memory of Leon and Lois Shaw. The Association thanks the families for these memorial gifts.

There's also a new bench outside the Ladies Fair building. This natural-edge bench was created from a locally harvested Big Rock cherry tree and an oak tree from Plowman's Park. The trees, at the end of their life, were saved from being burned, then cut into planks at a local saw mill and repurposed into a rustic bench to be enjoyed for many generations. This creative gift was handcrafted by two retired Big Rock guys, Ralph Stegall and Kris Melvin. Thank you.

Our premiums/prizes range from \$5 to \$30 with ribbons and over \$2,500 in prize money provided by our very generous sponsors, businesses and the Big Rock Plowing Match Association. This year we are introducing entry labels that entrants can print to attach to their entries. Take a look at the Premium List – by winning the most ribbons in all classes you may be the recipient of the Harley Davis Memorial award. And the questions are...*Why* isn't there a class for this or that on the Premium List? *How* can a new/different category or class get added? Each year the Committee reviews the Premium List to determine under-performing classes. Then individual classes are changed/introduced based on comments and suggestions received from participants. Prize money, provided by sponsors, enables the Ladies Fair to offer six sections, nineteen categories and over 140 classes. Categories and classes are added when a sponsor is secured to provide the prize money. In 2019, two new categories, each with four classes were added. 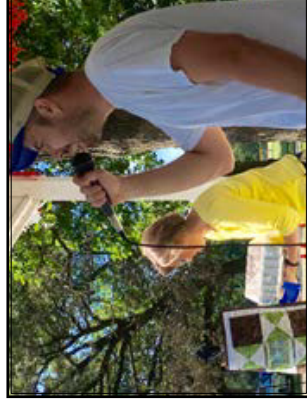

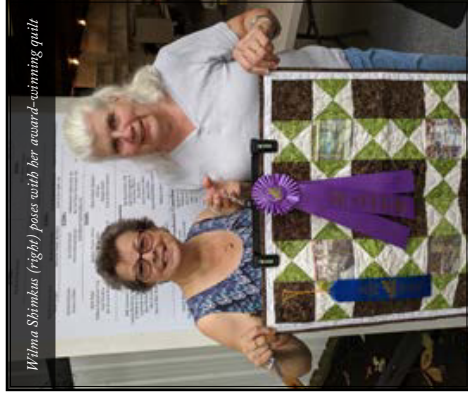

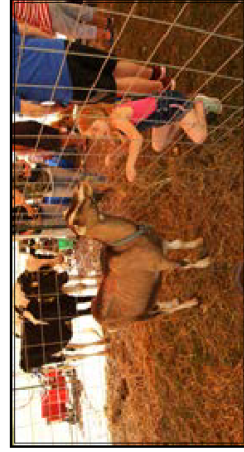
CHILDREN'S RACES

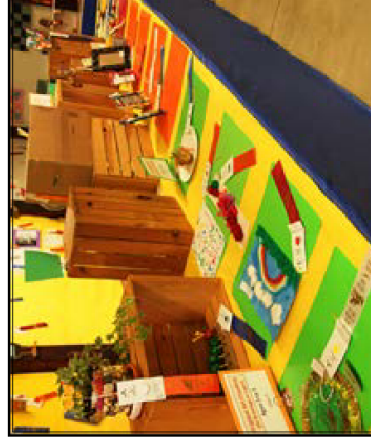

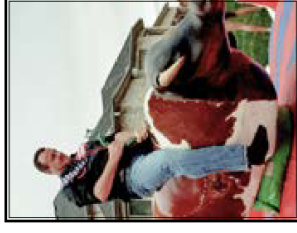


AMUSEMENT RIDES

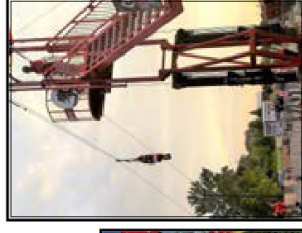

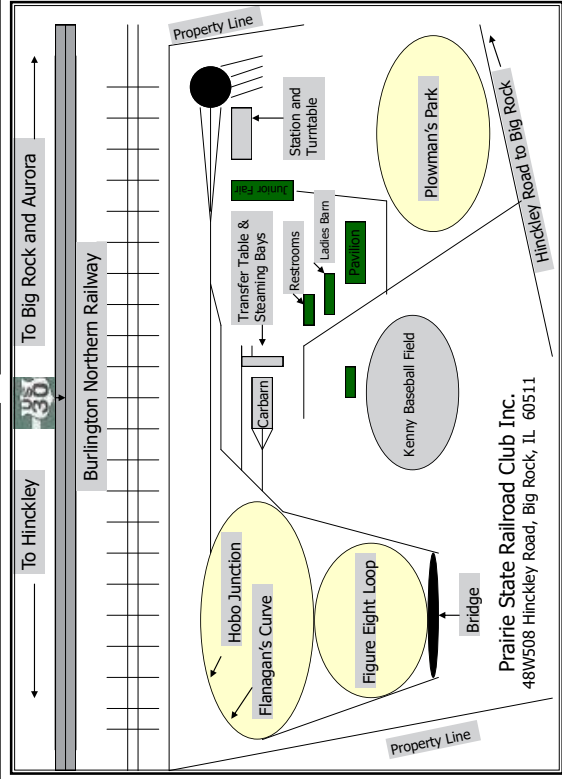
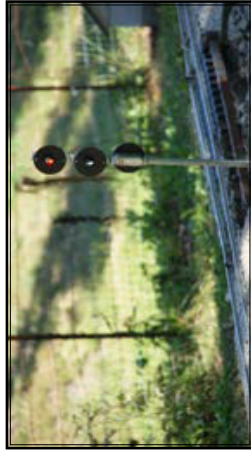
PRAIRIE STATE RAILROAD CLUB

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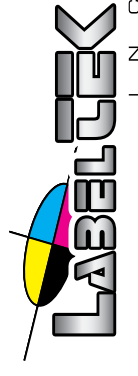
