

TREE REVITALIZATION AT PLOWMAN'S PARK

Think Plowman's Park and a vision of big, old trees comes to mind. And it should, as the park is classified as a Pre-Settlement Oak Ecosystem. Over 100 of these majestic trees range in age from 85-200 plus years and are showing their age. The Association recognized that to be a good steward we needed an arborist. About the same time, Kane County announced available grants. We applied and received a \$19K grant in 2024 from the Kane County Board, through its Office of Community Reinvestment, with funds from the Grand Victoria Riverboat Casino.

This grant enabled the Association to begin a multi-year project to revitalize the old growth trees with the goal of improving the health of and saving as many trees as possible. With guidance and expertise from Charles Shonts, ISA Certified Arborist, Davey Tree Expert Company, the property trees were identified and assessed to develop a plan within funding. Over 300 trees were located and GIS mapped. An inventory and assessment of 200 trees was provided with genus, species, condition, recommendations and relevant information.

In the first year, we prioritized the following actions: pruning, growth regulator, organic injection and application of biochar/compost soil amendment. The focus was on trees near buildings and locations where people are present. Within these priorities the tree species included: Bur Oak, Northern Red Oak, Swamp White Oak, White Oak and Shagbark Hickory, each assessed to be in fair to good structure/condition.

Davey Tree Expert Company began the multi-phase project in November with 15 trees receiving an application of a liquid soil growth regulator to help improve overall health and reduce stress by improving root system regeneration. Tree Pruning to remove dead, broken and minor cross over branches was conducted in December and January. Twenty-seven trees were trimmed and crown cleaned near the Concessions/Office, Junior Fair, Ladies Fair, train barn and adjacent to Kenny Field.

Surface application of biochar mixed with premium compost was spread under trees in two areas in January. This natural amendment improves soil structure providing a habitat for soil micro-organisms to help the trees pull/absorb more nutrients. This was followed by an organic injection applied to 30 trees in March. This liquid ground injection of natural compounds encourages soil micro-biology, with Phosphonates added to help improve plant defenses.













The Association did the rest. In April Gene Nehring aerated the soil in areas that received biochar/compost. Our gratitude to DeKane Equipment Corporation for use of equipment. Mulching next: aged wood chips from a July tree removal were transported and placed around trees by Ron Burgess and Terry Sorensen. Hinckley-Big Rock HS students, guided by teachers spread the wood chips around 15 trees to conserve/extend available water and moderate temperature extremes.

The grant provided \$19K, the Association \$15K and donations added \$10K to bring the project to a \$44K investment in the trees. We also benefitted from generous in-kind contributions. The Association is striving to ensure the trees thrive in the long term, to provide shade, cool and clean the air and keep the park vibrant under a majestic canopy.


FROM THE PRESIDENT

- All plowmen must plow 5 inches but not more than 7 inches deep.
- ♦ All plowmen must make 7 rounds.
- No assistance to any plowmen after the first round.
- All plowmen using 16-inch plows must plow not less than 14 inches.
- ◆ All plowmen using 14-inch plows must plow not less than 12 inches.
- All plowmen using 12-inch plows must plow not less than 10 inches.
- All plowmen must leave the field at designated finish time, unless granted more time by field committee for some reasonable cause.

All plowmen will be scored back:

- 4 points for each foot in width for not finishing the land by the specified finish time.
- 4 points for each inch less than the minimum depth of 5 inches.
- 4 points for each inch in excess of the maximum depth of 7 inches

DAVIS FIELD

SIGN WILL BE DEDICATED AT 8:30 AM ON SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 20, ON THE HISTORICAL SOCIETY GROUNDS



The Davis Family's interest in the Big Rock community spans decades. They have provided support through both service and philanthropy to community groups, especially the Big Rock Historical Society and the Big Rock Plowing Match Association.

From 1895 through 1960 the plowing competition was held on 28 individual farms throughout Big Rock Township. In 1950, the Association purchased the W. E. Thomas Grove, a 19-acre property, to host the plowman's dinner with the plowing competition still hosted on farms. Dwight and Anna Davis purchased land in 1957 with the idea that it could be used for the plowing competition as this field was across from Plowman's Park. The Davis Field land was first used as home to the plowing match in 1961 and continues today thanks to the Davis Family. Harley and Marvel Davis continued the family tradition of support with a provision in the Trust that the "farmland in Section 21, consisting of 49 acres, more or less, shall be used such that at least 25 acres are made available for the Big Rock Plowing Match each year for so long as the match continues to run."

So, when sorting through past issues of *Plowing Match Times* we came across a headline from 1968 that stated "Plowing will be held at the Davis Field across from Plowman's Park" the idea for a sign began. With both organizations in favor of acknowledging the Davis family's gift, the sign was designed, built and installed.

The sign was funded by the McMicken Family in Memory of Wyllie McMicken. In 1966, plowing with his trusty team of mules, Gertrude and Genevieve, Wyllie won first-place in the Horse & Mule Class. More about Wyllie in the 2024 issue of *Plowing Match Times* on the website.

This competition challenges kids to ride a pedal tractor and pull a weighted sled as far as they can. Lance Viland pulled the sled a measured distance of 50.4 feet in 2024. Very impressive, as the pedal tractor sled is designed to create friction as it is dragged and the weight moves forward making the sled difficult to pull.

There are six weight classes: under 30 pounds; 31-40 lbs.; 41-50 lbs.; 51-60 lbs.; 61-70 lbs.; and 71-80 lbs. Tips from previous winners: always look ahead: the faster you get going, the farther you'll go; and when it starts getting hard, pedal harder.

Registration will begin at 1:30 pm at the Cattle Ring. Pay the \$1 entry fee and weigh-in to qualify. The competition begins at 2 pm.



SUDS AND SOUNDS ON SATURDAY NIGHT



SEPTEMBER 26, 1925

At a meeting of the Executive Committee the three horse drawn plow classes (walking gang and sulky) were combined into one class to be known as the Open Field Class with prizes same as before. Because the old rule of 5" was not adhered to in the past the depth of plowing was changed to six inches as the maximum depth. A class for boys under 20 with tractor was introduced with one half of the Healy Prize (\$5) being placed on this class for Big Rock boy scoring highest. Plowing Match set for September 26, 1925.

SEPTEMBER 26, 1925

Due to heavy rains during the night and early morning the Match was postponed to Monday, September 28. Word of postponement sent to Telephone Centrals and Radio Broadcasting stations. Most of plowmen and many people were congregated for the match. Large numbers of people continued to come all day.

Monday, September 28, 1925

A beautiful day all day for the 30th Annual Plowing Match held on the H.S. Long farm 3 miles west of Big Rock. There were thirty entries in the match on Saturday and all were on hand again Monday to compete. Results are as follows:
