Our Board of Directors approved funding allocations for FY26, addressing the needs of residents within the 7 townships that INC serves in accordance with our Strategic Plan. There are 2 new agencies and 4 new programs. Of the two new agencies, one will provide needed services to youth

and infants in the IDD community, and the other will provide Mental Health First Aid community training and education. Three of the 4 new programs focus on addressing workforce shortages via paid internships and employee development & retention. The 4th new program focuses on improving access to care in underserved populations in our community. In total for FY26, INC will be funding over 2 million dollars in grants to 16 agencies and 37 programs. INC also keeps a small contingency fund for one-time funding requests that align with our funding policy.

The Big Rock Township 708 board meeting will be held on Thursday, October 7th at 7:00 p.m. at the Township office. Details for this public meeting can be found on our website at www.incmha.org.

SEPTEMBER HARVEST SEASON

The Village would like to take this opportunity to wish our residents a happy harvest season! Please be respectful of the farmers out on the roads as they work to produce this years crop. This is a busy time for our Village with school back in session, fall soccer season, homecomings and our own local Harvest festival, the 131st annual Plowing Match. Please watch out for each other and our small ones as we all navigate our busy weeks ahead. The Village sends a warm thank you to those people and organizations who have stepped forward to volunteer their time and resources to create the magic happening at our local events. We hope everyone has a safe and fun Plowing Match this year!

BURNING

With fall fast approaching and property cleanup underway, please keep in mind the Village's burning ordinance: Section 307.1.1. "Open burning of yard waste generated on the property shall be permitted. Yard waste shall include leaves, fallen trees, branches, grass, weeds and vines. No yard waste not generated from the property may not be openly burned. No other materials may be openly burned on the property. Open burning is only permitted on one's property. Open burning is permitted only between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Open burning is not permitted when the wind exceeds 10 m.p.h. All persons engaged in open burning on their property shall have immediate access to a water source or other source to extinguish the open fire". In addition - burning leaves directly on the roadway edge is strictly prohibited!!! Thank You in advance for doing your part in keeping community looking its BEST possible.

ANIMAL LEASH LAW

It has come to the Village's attention that recently we have had dogs off leashes and/or off their properties. Please remember that the Village does have an ordinance around this to ensure residents are keeping their animals on a leash. This provides safety for everyone! In addition, the Village has an IGA with Kane County to contract animal control to come out (for a charge) if the need arises. This charge will be billed to the homeowner if its deemed the animal(s) were in fact off leash and/or their own property. Please be respectful to those around you and make sure your animal(s) are under leash at all times.

We informed the Sherrif's department that we would like to pursue charges if the thieves are caught.

We have worked with the company who supplied them and have secured replacements for all 6 pieces that were stolen, which are once again available at the park. If you (or your children) have been disappointed they couldn't play come on back and get a game in! Being such a popular feature it was important to the board to get these replaced as soon as possible, and we would like to remind the community that we have cameras watching most of the park recording 24/7 and will pursue charges against any individuals stealing or vandalizing our equipment or buildings.

Cultivating Our Future: Kicking off the 2025-2026 School Year

The first days of school always bring with them a special kind of energy—excitement, optimism, and new beginnings. At Hinckley-Big Rock CUSD 429, we are thrilled to welcome back our students, staff, and families as we embark on the 2025–2026 school year. We also extend a heartfelt welcome to new students joining the Royal family, including our youngest Early Childhood learners, brand-new Kindergarteners, and 25 students who have recently moved into our district. Building & Grounds Updates

Over the summer, our Buildings and Grounds team has been hard at work ensuring our facilities are safe, efficient, and ready for learning. Highlights of this work include:

- Completion of the High School LED lighting upgrade and calibration of the new soccer field lighting which will save energy and provide excellent visibility for students and athletes.
- Network and phone system upgrades to improve communication and efficiency across all schools.
- HVAC improvements at the Middle School, including mechanical upgrades and a glycol flush to prepare the system for the heating season.
- New playground fencing for our Early Childhood program to ensure the safety of our youngest Royals.
- Continued attention to maintenance needs, from repainting to addressing condensation issues, to keep learning spaces comfortable and welcoming.

Financial Health of the District

As a community, you can be reassured that HBR 429 is in a strong financial position. The FY26 tentative budget reflects our district's commitment to fiscal responsibility while investing in projects and programs that directly support student learning. Highlights include:

- A projected year-end fund balance of \$10.1 million, which represents 72% of annual revenue, well above the Board policy requirement of 15%.
- A five-year forecast that remains positive, ensuring we can continue to grow our reserves and protect the district from financial uncertainty.
- Strategic use of reserves and grant funding to balance rising costs while maintaining a high state financial rating.

This year, our primary focus is on strengthening teaching and learning across all grade levels. Through our multi-year curriculum mapping and alignment process, we are ensuring that instruction is consistent, rigorous, and designed to help all students achieve. Our new district academic goals include increasing student growth on MAP and Progress Learning benchmarks, meeting or exceeding Illinois state averages on key assessments, and closing achievement gaps for special education and low-income students. These goals represent our ongoing commitment to giving every student the opportunity to succeed, supported by high-quality instruction and an aligned curriculum.
